ICC gets World Travel Award and gold status

T WAS double recognition for Durban's landmark Inkosi Albert Luthuli International Convention Centre Complex at the Indaba Travel Tradeshow with the centre retaining the title of Africa's Leading Convention Centre and being awarded Gold Classification by the Heritage Environmental Rating Programme.

The ICC secured the World Travel Award (WTA) for the ninth time at the glamorous second gala WTA African ceremony at Indaba – Africa's biggest annual tourism tradeshow – last night.

The gold Heritage Environmental Rating Programme recognition is for the centre's commitment to reducing the environmental impacts associated with the ICC and its operations.

The ICC first joined the Heritage Programme in 2007 and, since then, has shown a consistent reduction in energy and water consumption, as well as achieving positive results in its waste management systems.

It has also played an important role by increasing awareness among its clients and other organisations using the centre.

"We are ecstatic to have retained the title of the World Travel Award for Africa's Leading Convention Centre, but also the fact that Indaba has retained the title of Africa's Leading Travel Exhibition.

"We are partners in organising SA Tourism's big Indaba together with Tourism KZN and Durban Tourism, so we are all very happy to be part of the South African tourism industry's strong performance at the WTA African ceremony right here in Durban," said ICC chief executive Miller Matola.

"The Heritage Environmental Rating Programme recognition is reward for all the hard work our team has put towards achieving our environmental goals and it positions the ICC as an internationally responsible convention and exhibition facility," said Matola.

The decision to award the gold classification to the ICC was taken because of a number of noticeable improvements in the last year, including the introduction of event waste recycling stations; the
