Saudi prisoner

MIAMI — A Saudi prisoner was found dead at the US detention camp at Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, on Wednesday after apparently committing suicide, the US military said.

"The detainee was found unresponsive and not breathing in his cell by guards. The detainee was pronounced dead by a physician after all lifesaving measures had been exhausted," the military southern command said in a statement.

It described the death as "an apparent suicide" and said an investigation was being held.

The statement stressed that a cultural adviser was assisting the military to ensure that the remains are handled in a culturally sensitive and religiously appropriate manner.

Last year, US officials stirred worldwide outrage by describing three suicides at Guantanamo as "an act of asymmetric warfare" and "a good PR move" on the part of terror suspects. The detention camp is located on a Navy base set in southeastern Cuba on territory the United States occupies under the terms of a 1901 treaty since rejected by communist-led Cuba. — AFP

AFTER CLIMBING GLORY... 'Spiderman' gets 15-day jail

SHANGHAI - France's Alain Robert, ahead of his ascent of the 420.5-metre renowned for climbing the world's tallest buildings, wasn't going to let 15 days in a Chinese jail deter him from an attempt at scaling China's tallest building.

Clad in a Spider-Man costume, the 44year-old made a barehanded ascent and descent of the 88-storey Jin Mao Tower yesterday, achieving the feat in 90 minutes.

His feet had barely touched the ground when he was arrested by police.

Robert had decided to mount the ironand-glass structure without permission after authorities turned down two requests.

"If you obey all the rules, you miss the fun," Robert told Reuters in an interview

"I've scaled the three tallest buildings in the world, so I reckoned I should also climb the fourth-tallest building. It's like

there's something missing." Robert had consulted lawyers and French diplomats before the attempt and said he expected to face 15 days in custody and a fine of up to 10,000 yuan (\$1,300).

In 2001, Chinese shoe salesman Han Qizhi became the first person to scale the Jin Mao Tower.

Han, who had happened to walk by the building and acted on a "rash impulse", was detained for about two weeks. Reuters
