The proposed federal pharmacy law aims to cope with the international drug policies and create a balanced drug control policy.

Abras carried 9m commuters so far this year


DUBAI — Nine million passengers were transported by abras in 441,020 trips between the two banks of Dubai Creek during the first four months of this year, according to statistics released by Marine Transport Agency of Roads and Transport

Authority (RTA). "The number of commuters transported by motorised abras in 435,100 trips stood at 87,02,014 passengers from January up to the end of April this year, compared to 84,09,892 passengers transported in 420,494 trips during the same period last year.

A total of 4,617 passengers were transported by rowing abras in 5,920 trips from the beginning of January up to the end of April this year.
